主席的話

社群中的亮光 Shining light on our city

保羅上面這段寫給帖撒羅尼迦教會弟兄信眾的話洋溢著母性,因為他要讓這些 信眾感受到他對他們的感情和對這份關係的重視。

女性遠比男性重視感情和 關係—我在教會、監獄和 醫院的事奉經驗中,表現 出「不離不棄」的往往是 女性・所以囚禁這個大大 限制和其他人聯繫的懲罰 對女性在囚者產生的痛苦 是不難想像的。因此女性 監獄福音和牧養工作的情 緒和關係關顧元素比較重, 需要投入的感情和心力也 較多(出獄後的牧養也需 要比較貼身・所以更新會 女性宿舍的數目和入住收 納的人數相對比較少)。 但一經建立了關係・往往 能夠保持得比較長久・福 音果效也較好。

在女性在囚人士中,有不 少是非華裔人士,而且數 量在不斷增加;當中許多 來自非洲,因藏毒而被判 刑。這些女囚友一方面遠 離故郷・幾乎斷絕了和親 友的聯繫,另一方語言不 通(她們不少說法語或西 班牙語),自然產生焦慮 和怨憤(特別是那些感覺 被冤枉或被騙的),因而 容易和本地囚友和職員產 生磨擦—在一次和署長的 見面中・他明確表達對這 種情況的關注和希望本會

能夠加強對這些外籍女囚 友的牧養。

我們現在為這些囚友舉辦 的聚會會唱她們的詩歌, 或把詩歌翻譯成她們的語 言;亦盡量安排懂得該語 言的義工幫忙。聚會的內 容亦會協助她們疏導情緒 和明白怎樣和其他人相處。 感謝主我們有很多外語教 會幫忙在這方面的牧養。 但需要實在很大・請大家 為這方面的事工祈禱・好 讓我們能讓署方看到美好 的見證・更重要的是為這 些囚友帶來祝福。

2018 是更新會四十週年, 感恩不盡!深願我們的生 命,和主託付我們的事工, 在祂面前都是被悦納的 祭;更願我們牧養的更生 人士,能成為社群中的見 證與祝福!

外籍女性囚友事工

董怡馨牧師 (事工總主任)

由於外籍女囚友大多沒有親人在港,所以獄中的日子感到 非常孤單;思念在海外的兒女,想到無法目睹他們的成 長,內心掙扎不已。她們當中許多人犯法,為的是掙錢給 她們的孩子,但結果鋃鐺入獄,在孤立無助中轉向神,以 主耶穌為她們兒女的盼望。很感恩,神保守了她們的兒 女,不斷聽到她們的見證,數算主恩,十分激勵!



更新會對外籍女囚友的事工一直發展,服務的範圍 一再增加,也招募了更多 懂得不同外語的義工。雖 然外籍女囚友們來自不同

的宗教背景,但她們也願意來我們的宗教班認識基督教, 一開始她們會觀察其他信主所員的改變及義工的見證,久 而久之當她們聽到神的愛與寬恕,她們都願意相信神,也 經歷到神極大的恩典和憐憫。 由於語言不通,而且文化 上的差異也是極大的挑 戰,她們容易被挑釁發惡 或得罪別人,所以容易出



現負面情緒。她們都很喜歡宗教班內詩歌敬拜的時間,在 敬拜中跳舞、表達情感也令她們的情緒得到釋放。我們除 了一起敬拜,也討論生命的價值,幫助她們認識自己在基 督裡寶貴的身份,即使身處獄中,也能活出神在她們身上 的改變。

我們的使命是建立起女囚友的靈命,令她們可以互助成長,教導她們以聖靈的大能和神話語的應許來勝過負面情緒,亦希望她們可以在獄中藉見證祝福新到的或其他囚友。我們又希望聚合同語言的囚友來開設興趣小組,令她們有多一個渠道彼此溝通及分享,在共同語言下,她們也較容易學習其他技巧。我們盼望有一天外籍囚友可以運用她們的恩賜或所長,成為教導其他囚友的領袖,令她們有目標及使命,亦令不同文化能共融。

更生人士分享(之一) 感謝更新會和義工們

我是Jackie,來自肯亞。我被囚在香港羅湖懲教所7年,現已刑釋回到肯亞。

當我在羅湖懲教所時,我經歷很大的病患,加上孤單,令 我感到絕望。同時間,我的母親也患上癌症,我身處遠方 未能在病榻前侍候,令我非常擔心,也憂慮不知有沒有機 會再見一面。

在入獄之前,我覺得信仰與我沒有關係,但我在獄中經更新會的義工認識主。每月的宗教班,義工們都耐心地教導我聖經上的話,也教我如何禱告、經歷神、行事為人討神的喜悦。她們也每月來個別探訪我最少一次,與我傾訴,又帶來靈命日糧等的刊物給我。特別感謝更新會送了一本聖經給我,我至今還保留著,依然每天都會閱讀。

神帶給我平安,在我病患的時候,神説祂會醫治我。我渴望可以早日回家服侍病榻上的母親,神也賜給我盼望和信心。經歷聖靈的洗禮,我的生命不再一樣,神引領我走出黑暗,我事事依靠和順服神,每當我不知道、不明白,我求神令我知道祂的心意。



當我刑釋回到肯亞,我參與不同的探訪及義工服務。 感動我去幫助那些在藏毒、 麼事、實淫中迷途失变了 孩。前年,我終於成立了 名為"Doors of Hope"的 名為"Doors of Hope"的 在 養機構,名字取自經文「 思 數,我必賜她葡萄園, 又賜她

神以彌迦書的經文呼召我到 監獄服事,當時IECC的Ms. Brenda Cox介紹我給更新會的 同工思琴,她邀請我每月有兩 個主日到芝麻灣服事。那時是 2005年,雖然我第一次到芝



麻灣這麼遠的地方,但一想到能為神作工,內心便充滿喜樂。當有30個所員一同在神面前跪下接受救恩,不得不讚嘆聖靈的工作是何等奇妙。一個月之後,我收到其中一名所員的信,她在信中提及她因幾次自殺都不成功而非常怨憤,但當她和我傾談,被神的愛觸動,她醒悟是神在保護她,因為她還沒有聽聞福音和接受救恩。我一面讀她的信,眼淚一面流下來,我的心真的感動致極,對神救贖的愛充滿感恩!

可惜幾個月後我因家庭原因需要暫停芝麻灣的服事。但數年前,我又回到更新會服事,神讓我跟Esther及兩隊很好的義工合作,一起到羅湖懲教所及青山灣入境事務中心,她們教導我服事。神讓我有機會服事越南籍的所員,她們大部份都是北部的越南人,而我是南部的,南北部的人一直是敵對,但神以恩典和愛,將我與越北的所員連繫在一起。第一次與她們在宗教班見面時,她們稱我為"Bac",在越南是一個對父母級長輩的尊稱,那一刻我的心滿有神的愛,讚美主!

在更新會的服事是神賜予我 的福份,我一直呼求主在建 立祂的國中使用我,神治知 知道如何在最合適的地方用 我,「神能照著運行在我所 心裏的大力充充足足地成就 一切,超過我們所求所想的。

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Chairman's Message

We were not looking for praise from people, not from you or anyone else, even though as apostles of Christ we could have asserted our authority. Instead, we were like young children among you. Just as a nursing mother cares for her children, so



we cared for you. Because we loved you so much, we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well. (1 Thessalonians 2:6-8)

Paul wrote this to the brothers and sisters of church in Thessalonia from the perspective of a mother's love, to let them feel how Paul cared about and treasured their relationship.

Females care more about love and relationships: this is a conclusion from my work experience in churches, prisons and hospitals. Females seldom give up relationships easily. It is a huge punishment for female prisoners that they are not allowed to connect with others. We emphasise on emotional wellbeing and relationships in our work with female inmates. We pour more love and care into the relationship and once it is built, it is for a long time. After they are released, we also need to spend time with them, walk with them side

by side. (This is also reflected on why the number of people in our female hostel is less than the male hotels.)

The percentage of non-Chinese female prisoners is increasing, many of them are from Africa, arrested for trafficking. They are so worried and angry (especially those who felt cheated into their cases) as they are far from home and their family. Also due to language differences, many speak French or Spanish, making it easy for them to have conflict with local prisoners and staff. In a meeting with the Commissioner of Correctional

Service Department (CSD), he was also concerned about the situation and hoped we could put more effort in serving the ON inmates.

During the bible classes we hold in prison, we sing hymns in their language, or translate lyrics into their language. We usually arrange volunteers who are able to speak their language to sit with them to make sure they can understand the content. The contents include how to release negative emotions and how to keep good relationship with others. Thanks to the Lord that we have plenty of churches helping in the ON ministry yet there are still huge needs. Please pray for our ON ministry, to have a positive impact on the CSD and continue to bless the ON inmates.

Thanks to God that we are celebrating our 40th Anniversary in 2018. May our ministry and lives continue to be consecrated to God. May the rehabilitated persons we serve be a light and blessing to our city.

The Other-Nation (ON) Women Ministry

Pastor Esther Tung (Chief Ministry Officer)

ON inmates often feel very isolated while incarcerated in Hong Kong as most of their family members are overseas. Many of them have children overseas and really struggle with not being able to see them grow up. Many committed crimes for the sake of making money to support their children. However, when they are imprisoned they turn to Jesus as He is the only hope for their children. It's very

encouraging to hear their testimonies of how God finds a way to care for their children while they are incarcerated.



The KSA ministry to ON women is always in development as we seek to allow the word of God to impact their lives in a meaningful way. Initiatives we have taken up are providing more volunteers who can speak in various languages. There are many ON inmates from a variety of religious backgrounds who join the meetings as they have the time and freedom to explore Christianity. They join our classes and observe the volunteers and other Christian inmates to see how they behave. Many have turned to Jesus when they hear about His love and forgiveness. They then experience His grace and mercy in a very powerful way.

The cultural differences between the inmates also provide a huge challenge for them as they are often easily provoked to anger or they unknowingly offend others. Encouraging inmates to share their songs and allow opportunities for

inmates to dance in praise, provides an outlet for them to express themselves and release their emotions to God. The last few Bible series have focused on worship and identity in order to help inmates see their worth in Christ and that their lives can be a living sacrifice to God in whatever they do even inside the prison.



Our vision for this ministry is that we build up the Spiritual resources of the women so that they will be able to mentor and teach each other.

We teach them how to overcome negative emotions by the power of the Holy Spirit and the promises from God's words. Also that they can use their time inside to be a blessing to the prison by sharing their faith and testimonies of God's care for them to new arrivals. We also hope to have opportunities to open language specific interest groups and in order to provide a space for them to share their thoughts and feelings and help them to develop other skills in order to have additional outlets for them to express themselves.

The hope is that there can be a meaningful cultural exchange in the future where ON believers can become leaders inside the prison and share some of their expertise in areas where they have been especially gifted or trained in their own countries, thereby providing a purpose and focus for them and benefitting the prison in becoming a more culturally rich place. They can be an example to others on 'marketplace' (in this case it is the prison where they work and live) mission and witness through life evangelism and example.

Sharings from ex-inmates – A. Thank you Kun Sun and volunteers

I am Jackie. I am from Kenya. I served at Lo Wu Correctional Institution in Hong Kong for 7 years and currently I am back home in Kenya.

When I was at Lo Wu, I was passing through several things like sicknesses, loneliness, and hopelessness. My mother was sick also, and being so far away from her made me not know what to do. I was so worried about mother's health, but I was sick too, I was so afraid that I couldn't see my family again. Before I was arrested, I did not have a personal relationship with God. But through the Kun Sun volunteers at Lo Wu, I met God.



They were so patient with me, they taught me the word of God through the monthly bible study group. In the bible study group, we were taught how to pray, how to come to God, how to behave and build a good attitude.

They also visited me one to one at least once a month. I also got a lot of support from the Bible, "Our Daily Bread" and other reading materials. Thank you to Kun Sun, I received a Bible from Kun Sun, I have kept it and still read it every morning till now.

Through His word, God gave me peace, I knew that even if I was going through that sickness, He is going to heal me. And I longed to be home with my mother again who was also sick, God give me hope and strength, I had faith in his promises. I got

the baptism of the Holy Spirit. And then my life just changed. I started to rely on Him and listen to Him. He was my guide, my light. Whatever I did not understand, I wondered and I would ask God to help me know about His mind.

After I was released and returned home, I started to visit and become a volunteer of various charity homes and an old village. God gave me strength to start an organization to help girls who are lost in things like trafficking, drugs, prostitution, etc. Finally I was able to register an organization which is called "Doors of Hope". The name is an inspiration that I got from Bible, Hosea 2:15 "There I will give her back her vineyards, and will make the Valley of Achor a door of hope." Besides taking care of the girls, we have a support center to teach children in poverty or disabled people, to give them speech therapy, literacy classes, bible classes, in which we take them three days a week. For those mothers who are



unemployed, we will teach vocational skills and entrepreneurship skills, so they can make their living. Some of these skills I learnt while in Hong Kong, and I am happy that I can use them now.

Thank you Kun Sun and the volunteers. God bless you all!


You became my family in a foreign land, you raised me up when I was down. May the Lord keep rewarding you abundantly as you continue to support and

My service with Kun Sun had to come to an end after a few months due to family's needs. But praise be to God, I was able to resume as a volunteer with



Kun Sun a few years ago. Serving under the leadership of Esther Tung with two wonderful teams has been a privilege that I will not take for granted. Visiting Lo Wu Correctional Institution and Castle Peak Immigration Centre (CIC) has taught me so much about God's love and His transforming power in the lives of people. One of the unique and special opportunities that the Lord has allowed me to do is to share the gospel with the Vietnamese population at both centers. Most of the Vietnamese ladies are from the northern part of Vietnam, and I am a southerner. In the past, we would consider ourselves as enemies. But God, in His mercies and love, placed those northerners and me together. The first time I had met this group of ladies and was called, "Bac" (a respectful way to address an older woman who might be the same age or older than one's mother or father), my heart was flooded with God's amazing love. Praise God for those who had prayed to receive His gift of eternal life through Christ Jesus!

Being a part of the prison ministry with Kun Sun is a blessed privilege that God has bestowed in my life.
