書信組義丁訓練

更新會書信事工分享

書信事工 盧志揚 (事工總主任)

監獄事工與書信事工是形影不離、分不開的。當同工、 義工進入監獄宗教班事奉之後,亦會以書信作跟進。

80年代,更新會已成立書信組,服侍的對象主要是青少年和赤柱監獄被判終身的所員,除了安排義工與所員寫信外,亦設立「曙光信箱」為所員解答信仰上和其他問題,從「曙光」這名稱可以想像到書信對在囚人士來說,是帶給他們「亮光」及「希望」。



透過書信,他們可以分享擔心困擾的事情、內心的感受、信仰的疑問、監內的人際關係、案件及上訴事宜等等。書信提供一個很好的平台與他們溝通交往、建立關係及在信仰上牧養他們。雖然很多時候,義工們不能具體幫助他們解決問題,但能夠使他們知道及感受到有人在關心和聆聽他們,更會為他們獻上禱告,已經是莫大的幫助。

書信對象

每逢復活節和聖誕節,本會都會在各監獄院所舉行佈道會,每次佈道會後,都大約有60-100多位所員朋友回應想與義工通信;另外,參加宗教班的所員,亦是我們的書信對象;更有所員主動來信,希望安排義工與他們書信交往。

監獄有句常話:「監獄沒有秘密」,所員平常都害怕與其他所員分享個人私事,因怕自己的秘密會被傳開,就很尷尬。但他們對書信義工有信任,知道義工們會為他們守密,可以暢所欲言。並在義工分享的內容中,可以瞭解外界的事,減少與社會脱節。

書信之難

現今我們寫信後,貼上一枚2元郵票就可以寄出,非常容易。但對所員來說就並非如此,監獄每星期只會要用一個免費郵票給他們,若他們要多寄一封信,便要用自己的工資去買郵票,而他們「每月」的工資約500元,所以每個郵票對他們來說都非常珍貴,他們會寫信為專門大學的人,但不可能不可能有很多原,與有郵票、亦可能可能不好、情緒受困擾、內疚、所員之間的衝突,他們容易將自己也完養工戶,一定要有心理準備,筆友不回信有很多,則是沒有郵票、亦可能衝突,他們容易將自己也多。這方面的服侍,需要是恒久忍耐的愛。

義工美好的事奉

曾有一位義工,每月風雨不改寫一封信給所員,直至他出監前,他回信說感謝在過去兩年間,共收到24封信,他一直保留這叠寶貴的信,看完又看,他見到自己生命的改變,又多謝義工的愛心,常為他代求!

又有一位很年輕加入書信組的義工,她忠心事奉主,現已連續32年,仍然專一地在書信組的事奉主及關愛筆友。

另一位義工,因一次聽了由終身被囚者的弟兄作曲填詞、主唱及見證的「自由夢」CD後,深受感動,神的呼喚她作義工,轉瞬間,已回應呼召她的主10年。

一位曾患重病的義工,蒙神眷顧醫治及使用,有一次在一星期內她收到5位所員的5封回信,她何等興奮和感恩!當時她正值手指關節痛,但仍然堅持回信,恐怕遲了回覆而躭延,令我為她又擔心又感恩。

一位姊妹的父親在獄中悔改信主,其父之前內心剛硬,神何等奇妙的救恩臨到他,並在獄內困苦時,神垂聽他的祈禱。姊妹樂意報答天父的作為來作義工,她的事奉帶著負擔,常常記念被囚者及關心他們。

有些義工最初未懂得怎樣與在囚者通信,經過一些時間,他們願意在書信上改進,回信多了,他們在事奉上 亦滿有喜樂。

書信除了個人外,教會團體參與亦很重要,可以凝聚弟 兄姊妹在教會定期分享,書信交流,同心禱告,互相支 持鼓勵,何等美好的事奉。

惟願恩主引導大家,可以參與此事奉,透過文字表達出 神的心腸、愛心關懷和生命信息!

聖經承授課程 梁炳光 (事工主任)

除與所員書信往來,我們亦會鼓勵所員以不同方式去認 識信仰,並作出生命的抉擇。

在囚人士平均每月可以出席一次至兩次院所內的宗教班,和同工義工接觸的時間有限,為彌補宗教班牧養時間的不足,亦鼓勵所員親自打開聖經,讓聖靈透過上主的話語作啟發的功夫,更新會提供了一系列的聖經函授課程,不單讓所員善用在囚時間在正面積極的課程上,減少惡習,更有系統及按部就班的讓所員認識聖經,建立閱讀聖經的習慣,加強所員的紀律和自信,更願意計劃自己的未來。

現時我們為所員提供三種聖經函授課程,包括:

A. 慕道班

內容覆蓋整個基督教基本信仰,讓所員能整全的明白所信的是什麼,亦成為所員決志受洗的指標。

B. 生命之光課程

單元一:人生的問題

幫助所員發出和生命有關的問題,把自己連結在上主的話語上。

單元二:約翰福音

讓所員認識耶穌基督是上主獨生子的身份, 進深了解「道成肉身」和「救贖」對人生命的意義。

單元三:使徒行傳

讓所員在聖靈的帶領下,如使徒一般明白正確無誤的真理,一生一世跟從耶穌的腳踪。

單元四:加拉太書

讓所員明白不是因行為得救,而是「因信稱義」,只有 透過十架的救贖,才能解除罪的捆綁。

C. 以馬忤斯課程

課程由以馬忤斯聖經函授學校提供,涵括慕道初信課程、新約課程、舊約課程及專題課程四個系列,合共45個單元,為所員打好堅實的信仰基礎,充份準備迎戰出獄後的更新生活。

另外,批改所員作業的重任是由10位忠心耿耿的義工負責,他們不單批改所員答案的錯對,更會細心留意所員在一些感受或反省性問題的回答,從而了解所員的信仰狀況,作出合適的回應,對積極用心的所員去加以肯定,信仰有偏差的所員作出指正,對生命有灰心的所員作出鼓勵,另外,若批改義工發現所員有一些紀律(例如抄襲)或情緒的問題,亦會向負責同工回報,令同工更有效的跟進。感恩各批改義工都樂意透過函授課程,以筆杆成為所員信仰上的同行者。

2019年度(截至10月)分別有264位及44位所員修讀「生命之光」及「以馬忤斯」課程,其中有24位已完成了「生命之光」課程,繼續修讀「以馬忤斯」課。

願上主繼續祝福加力每一位努力修讀課程的所員,亦為 每一位批改義工的辛勞而感恩!

我是更新會書信組義工Grace,加入更新會寫書信已經 10年了。

記得2008年在一次教會崇拜後,教會派發了一張更新會的詩歌光碟,裏面是監獄裏的所員創作的詩歌。我回家聽後,很受感動!詩歌的歌詞寫得很好,很有意思!內容全是他們的心聲。不知為何?這些詩歌感動著我,使我想服事在囚的人士。因此,2009年便加入了更新會做書信的義工,不經不覺就這麼多年了。

起初接觸的書信對象,大多數是長刑期的,也有終生監禁的,這使我可以長時間來關心他們,和他們建立關係。書信初期,有些所員有回信,有些卻無回音。有回信的,是一件很開心的事!大家並不認識,願意回信及傾訴心聲,被他們信任,彼此成為朋友,真是很難得的。

在筆友中,有一位是孤兒,親友已失去聯絡,頗為孤單。他很喜歡通信,每一次都很快地回信分享他的心聲,有時他會畫一些畫來表達他的心境,大家都無所不談,在關心他的同時,也和他分享基督的信仰,更新會也會鼓勵他做一些聖經函授課程,使他更多認識神,有著真正的倚靠。

有些所員被囚的年期長,與他們通信久了,有時沒有什麼話題,真不知說什麼好?便嘗試建議他們做一些英文練習,以改善英文水平及增值自己:結果反應不錯,也吸引了同倉其他所友也有興趣做,他們主動要求加入,很奇妙地因而多了一些新的筆友,可以認識關心他們及分享信仰,真是感恩!

Chairman's Message

The protests caused by the amendments to the Fugitive Offenders Ordinance have been going on for half a year. Not only there have been no signs of things calming down, but it appears they are becoming more and more intense. Hong Kong society has been greatly shocked and people have been greatly affected and traumatized. The violence that occurred during this period has caused great harm to many people. The atmosphere of fear, hate and distrust has an even greater impact to the society. Many churches faced many internal and external pressure during this storm. Internal pressure came from different views among co-workers and also brothers and sisters in Christ. There are many different expectations and demands by the brothers and sisters. External pressure came from the society which pushing churches to react to expectations and criticisms of others regarding the protests.



We invited Mr. Philip Mak to share to our co-workers about "How to be prepared to serve the people arrested and imprisoned for political activities"

KSA did not face as much stress as the church in these circumstances but we face another difficulty and a different kind of pressure. The number of people arrested in this incident is increasing day by day which means the number of people sentenced to undertake jail time will not be small. How to shepherd this group of inmates would be a problem for us to face. In theory, no matter who you are, all the inmates are the target of our service. But in reality, this is a very sensitive situation. It would be challenging for us to properly consolidate the beliefs of those who believe in the Lord or to effectively share the gospel with un-believers. We must also be careful not to cause misunderstanding. Preparing our co-workers and volunteers to face these challenges is also what we should think about.

Anyway, we will not give up the responsibility for pastoral care and evangelization and we pray that the Lord will give enough time and wisdom for us to get prepared. Please contact us if anyone knows church brothers or sister who have been arrested and imprisoned and who needed to be visited and cared. We believe "For no one is cast off by the Lord forever. Though he brings grief, he will show compassion, so great is his unfailing love. For he does to willingly bring affliction or grief to anyone." (Lamentations 3:31-33)

P.S. Originally I was asked to talk about the lettering-writing ministry in the Chairmans's message. However, I feel that we must talk about the difficulties we will face concerning

the recent situation in Hong Kong. Yet the ministry of letter-writing also requires everyone's attention. Not everyone is able to participate in prison visits. And we may not be able to indepthly share a topic even on face-to-face communication due to the atmosphere and time constraints. Letters can communicate in a much deeper way and can be more detailed. The letter writers can sometimes speak more freely as they are not communicating face-to-face. We, of course, understand that all correspondences have been seen by the CSD so not all things can be said. But these letters have given great support and comfort to the inmates.

Kun Sun Letter Writing Ministry Sharing

Letter Writing Ministry

Mr. Johnny Lo (Chief Ministry Officer)

Prison ministry and letter-writing ministry are connected with each other. When co-workers and volunteers hold religious class in prisons, they will follow up with letters.



In the 1980s, KSA had set up the letter-writing ministry to serve youth inmates and the lifers in Stanley Prison. Apart from arranging volunteers to write letters to inmates, they also set

up a "Dawn Mailbox" to answer the questions by inmates about their beliefs and other matters. The name "Dawn", means letters can bring "light" and "hope" to the prison.

Through the letters, the inmates can share their worries, feelings, interpersonal relationships in prison or talk about religion questions, their court cases or appeals. Letters provide a good platform to let the volunteers to communicate with inmates, and also build relationships with and shepherd them. Although volunteers can't specifically help them to solve problems, it is already a great comfort to let them know and feel that someone is caring and listening to them, and also praying for them.

Every Easter and Christmas, KSA holds evangelistic meetings in various institutions. Usually about 60-100 inmates respond to ask for a pen-pal after each evangelistic meeting. In addition, we write to the participants of the religious classes, and there are some inmates write to us to ask for a pen-pal.

There is a common saying in prison: "There are no secrets in prison". The inmates are usually afraid to share personal matters with others because they fear that their secrets will be spread around, making them feel embarrassed. But they can speak freely to the volunteers of letter-writing ministry as they trust the volunteers will keep their secrets. Inmates can understand the outside world by the sharing of life stories and the outside issues by volunteers, thus reducing their disconnection from society.

After we write a letter, we just simply put a \$2 stamp to post it, but this is not the case in prison. Inmates are given one free stamp every week. If they want to send more than one letter, they will have to use their own wages to buy stamps. Each stamp is very precious to them as their wages are only around \$500 monthly. They will choose to write to some important people, such as their wives and children, friends, or lawyers. As volunteers for the letter-writing ministry, we must be prepared for no replies. There are many reasons for inmates not to reply: maybe they have no stamps, maybe they are in a bad mood, feel guilty, their relatives are sick, or have conflict between inmates, etc. All these reasons make it difficult for them to share in a letter. It is a total different world inside and outside the prison, so we need to have a long-lasting love and be patient in this service.

There was a volunteer who wrote letters to an inmate every month without fail, but get no reply. However, when the inmate was released from prison, he replied to the volunteer with thanks, saying that he had received 24 letters in the past two years. He kept these valuable letters with him and always read them. He got a new life in the prison, and thanked the volunteer for her love.

There was a volunteer who joined the letter-writing ministry who served inmates for 32 years. She says she will continue to serve God and care for inmates with her letters.

Another volunteer was deeply touched, after listened to the CD "On Freedom's Wings". The songs on this album were written by lifers, and shared their testimonies. God called her to become a volunteer and she had since served the letter-writing ministry for 10 years.

A volunteer who had been seriously ill, was treated and used by God. One time she received five letter responses from inmates in a week. She was excited and grateful but she was suffering from finger joint pain at the same time. However, she still insisted to write replies immediately, she didn't want any delay to make the inmates upset. I was so worried about her illness.

One sister's father believed in the Lord while in prison. Before conversion, he had a hard heart, but God's wonderful salvation came to him. God listened to his prayers when he was in prison. The sister wants to repay the Father's work and now serves as a volunteer and always keeps inmates needs in prayer.

Some volunteers didn't know how to communicate with the inmates at first. After some times, they have improved in their writing and received more replies, and they were filled with joy in serving.

In addition to individual volunteers, the church participation is also important for letter ministry and is a good source of brothers and sisters serving in the ministry. They can regularly share, pray together, support and encourage each other.

I hope that the Lord will guide everyone to participate in this ministry and express God's compassion, caring, and message through writing!

Bible correspondence courses

In addition to writing letters with inmates, we also encourage inmates to know God in different ways.

On average, inmates can attend religious classes in the institution once or twice a month, and have limited contact with us. To fulfill the lack of pastoral time in religious classes, inmates are encouraged to open the Bible in person and let the Holy Spirit enter them through the Lord's word. KSA provides a series of Bible correspondence courses, which not only allow the inmates to make good use of their time in prison and keep away from their bad habits, but also let the inmates know the Bible systematically and step by step. Building the habits of Bible reading can strengthen the discipline and self-confidence of inmates, and encourage them to plan their own future.

We currently offer three correspondence courses for inmates, including the following:

Catechumenate

This course covers the entire basic Christian faith, so that inmates can fully understand what they believe, and it has also become an indicator for the determination of the inmates to be baptized or not.

Light of Life

Module 1: Problems in Life - Help inmates to ask questions about life and connect themselves to God's Word.

Module 2: The Gospel of John - Enables inmates to know the identity of Jesus Christ as the only begotten Son of God, and have a deeper understanding of the meaning of "incarnation" and "redemption" on human life.

Module 3: Acts - Enables inmates, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to understand genuine truths as apostles, and to follow Jesus in their lifetime.

Module 4: Galatians - Enables inmates to understand that it is not salvation by deeds, but "justification by faith". Only through the redemption of the cross can the bondage of sin be lifted.

Emmaus: The Way of Faith

Four courses are provided by Hong Kong Emmaus, which include: Approaching, New Testament, Old Testament and Special Topics, a total of 45 units. This lays a solid foundation for the inmates and fully prepares them for the challenges that come after their release.

In addition, 10 loyal volunteers are responsible for correcting the assignments of the inmates. They not only correct the answers, but also pay close attention to the inmates' answers so as to understand their beliefs and give appropriate responses. The volunteers affirm the inmates who are on the right track, make corrections where necessary to mistaken beliefs, and encourage those who are discouraged in life. In addition, if volunteers found disciplinary issues (such as plagiarism) or emotional problems, they will report to us for follow-up. KSA is grateful that the volunteers are willing to use correspondence courses to walk together with the inmates.

In the fiscal year 2019 (up to October), 264 and 44 inmates respectively took the "Light of Life" and "Emmaus course", in which 24 have completed the "Light of Life" course and will continue to take the "Emmaus: The Way of Faith".

May the Lord continue to bless everyone who is working hard on these courses, and thanks to the volunteers for their hard work!

Editor's note: KSA also co-organizes the Onesimus Training Program with the Hong Kong Baptist Theological Seminary's distance education courses to provide a theological correspondence course for firm believers in jail to help them improve their spiritual lives and to bear fruitful lives for witnessing God.

Volunteer sharing Grace

I am Grace, a volunteer of the KSA letter ministry, and I have been writing letters to inmates for 10 years.

I remember that after worship in 2008, the church distributed a CD of KSA, which consisted of hymns written by inmates. After I played the CD, I was really touched! The lyrics of the hymns were well written and very meaningful. The content all arose out of their minds and emotions. These songs touched me with no reason and made me want to serve these inmates in prison. Therefore, in 2009, I joined the KSA as a volunteer for the letter-writing ministry, and it has been so many years until now.

At the beginning, I was writing to long-term prisoners. This allowed me to care them for a long time and build relationships with them. Some replied to my letters, but some did not respond. I was very happy to receive their replies to share their hearts with me. I really treasure being trusted by them, and become friends as we got to know each others.

Among the pen-pals, one is an orphan and lost contact with his relatives and friends. He felt lonely. He likes writing letters with me very much. He quickly writes back to share his thoughts after receiving my letter. Sometimes he draws pictures to express his feelings. We share about everything in letter. I also share the gospel with him. At the same time, KSA staff encourage him to take Bible correspondence courses, so that he knows more about God and has real trust in Him.

Some of my pen-pals have long sentences, and I have been writing letters with them for many years. Sometimes I can't think of anything to talk about, and I really don't know what to say. I tried to suggest to do some English exercises to improve their English and upgrade their knowledge. The response was good, and their self-motivation also attracted other inmates to join in. It is wonderful that I have some new pen-pals because of this change. Then I can care for and share the gospel with these new pen-pals. I'm really grateful!

I see God's grace in the service of letter writing! God uses this ministry to bring His love to the people in prison. Just as the Bible says "..... to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Thanks be to God!
